


President's Message

HURRICANE PREP NOTES FROM TONY MILLET BEFORE THE EVENT:

Preparation should start 7 days before the arrival of the hurricane, be prepared for a 3 day stay.

Indoors: Prepare a space and divide for

- 1- Healthy plants
- 2- Sick or borderline plants

Check for shade cloth to return orchids outside to replace damaged cloth.

Refresh your fungicides and bactericides.

The indoor space should have a closed door to keep insects from spreading

Provide fan(s). Try not to stack plants one on top of the other.

PLANTS TO BRING IN:

All irreplaceable plants

All AOS Awarded plants

All sensitive, finicky, valued plants

All plants in bud and bloom

All specialty stud plants

All seedlings under 2 years old

All very expensive one of a kind

OUTDOORS

Wrap orchid bench in orange safety mesh.

Tie tags to the bulbs so they stay with the plant.

Under the bench provides some protection from rolling around, and from the sun if shade cloth damaged.

Learn from your plans if changes must be made.



The **BLUE SOAP** insecticide recipe Tony Millet told us about at our June 10th FGOS meeting.

Step 1: Fill a 3 Liter (water) bottle 2/3 full. (3 liters = .66 gallons). The amount of water equates to about 2 quarts.

Step 2: Cut about 1/3 of the soap, then cut into four pieces – it may crumble a bit.





Step 3: Drop the cut up 1/3 bar of soap into the bottle, close the top, and shake.





Step 4: Decant some into a smaller bottle, then pour the top 2-3 inches of the blue slurry into a spray bottle. Add water to the top of the spray bottle.







Now you're ready to spray the plant roots and leaves and never worry about inhaling toxins.

Good for months. You can spray it anytime, anywhere, however <u>not on open flowers</u>. You can spray on buds, even on 2-year old seedlings!
